

## Morphological type

(1) Hiri Motu (Papua New Guinea) — *IHL* 219

Laegu sinana gwarume ta ia hoia Koki dekenai  
*my mother fish one she bought Koki at*

‘My mother bought a fish at Koki.’

- What type is this language?
- Is this sentence a perfect example of that morphological type?

(2) Japanese

tabe-sase-rare-na-katta  
*eat-CAUS-PASS-NEG-PAST*

‘(someone) was not made to eat (something)’

(3) Turkish

deniz-ler-im-iz-de  
*ocean-PL-1POSS-PL-in*  
‘in our oceans’

(4) Latin: Present tense of the verb ‘love’

<i>1st person</i>	amo	amamus
<i>2nd person</i>	amas	amatis
<i>3rd person</i>	amat	amant
