

Conference browsing

The goal of this exercise is for the class to compare notes and get an overall sense of some current topics in phonological research. Hopefully, this will help you get started thinking about potential topics for your final squib project!

- Do a web search to find the **webpage** for one of the following conferences, from 2021 or later:
 - AMP (Annual Meeting on Phonology)
 - OCP (Old-World Conference on Phonology)
 - mfm (Manchester Phonology Meeting)
 - LSA (Linguistic Society of America)
- Find the **conference program** for the conference and year you are interested in, and look over the titles/abstracts included or linked there. (If you are looking at the LSA conference, which is huge and multi-topic, try to filter the online conference program to display only phonology sessions.)
- Identify some kind of **recurring theme**: Are there keywords, topics, research questions, or formal approaches that are used by **at least three** of the talks/posters at the conference you are looking at? Ideally, try to pick a recurring theme that interests you or relates to your own favorite phonology topics! (But this is not required.)
- **Bring your recurring theme**, and **three talk/poster titles** that relate to it, to class discussion, and prepare to share what you've found!
