

Contrast, predictability, distribution — Key points

Here are the key points to review for the distribution part of the foundational skills quiz.

- (1) Be able to define and apply the following terms:
 - (a) **phoneme**
 - (b) **allophone**

- (2) Be able to explain how **predictable** / **contrastive** distribution relates to phoneme / allophone status, and **why** (with respect to our linguistic model)

- (3) Be able to determine whether the **distribution** of two (or more) sounds in a data set is predictable or contrastive
 - (a) Be able to **make a case** for your position, using specific and concrete evidence from the data set
 - (b) Be able to use **phonetic properties** to state insightful generalizations where possible

- (4) Given a case where the distribution of two or more sounds is predictable, be able to:
 - (a) Make a **generalization** (using properties, word edge position, etc.) about what the predictable environment is
 - (b) Determine the **basic allophone** of a phoneme, or explain why there is no clear choice for a basic allophone
 - (c) Determine a **UR** for a phoneme, and **make a case** for your proposal
