- Examples of Chamorro infixation seen in Baker (1985), with the passive morpheme /-in-/

saolak	sinaolak		‘to spank’
dulalak	dinulalak	→ <u>di</u> n ⁱ l ^a lak (vowel harmony)	‘to follow’

faisen	finaisen		‘to ask’
ʔadʔek	ʔinadʔek		‘to choose’
ʔespiha	ʔinespiha		‘to seek’
tuŋoʔ	tinuŋoʔ	→ <u>ti</u> n ⁱ ŋoʔ (vowel harmony)	‘to know’
konneʔ	kinonneʔ	→ <u>ki</u> n ⁱ neʔ (vowel harmony)	‘to take’
