- (1) Draw syntax trees for the following sentences. You only need to show the completed tree. For these particular sentences, it is safe to use your intuitions about *constituent structure* (which words combine into phrases) in the English translations in order to make assumptions about the Japanese sentences.
 - (a) Ken-ga odot-ta.

Ken-NOM dance-PST 'Ken danced.'

(b) Ken-ga ano keeki-o yai-ta.

Ken-NOM that cake-ACC bake-PST 'Ken baked that cake.'

(c) Ano keeki-ga oisi-katta.

that cake-NOM delicious-PST 'That cake was delicious.'

(2) Consider the following sentence. Give a plausible translation into English (more than one may be possible; you only need to give one). Then draw a syntax tree for the sentence that is compatible with the meaning you chose for your translation.

Warat-ta to omo-u. *laugh-pst C think-npst*
