1. Phonetics of Japanese

- Questions to consider:
 - What **vowels** occur in Japanese?
 - What **consonants** occur in Japanese?

2. Vowels of Japanese

- Phonetic properties that are useful for classifying vowels in all languages:
 - height
 - backness
 - rounding
- **Height** and **backness**: See this <u>X-ray video</u> From Peter Ladefoged's *Vowels & Consonants* web site, via YouTube
- **Rounding**: See this <u>comparison</u> of French and Japanese high back vowels From Vance (2008), *The sounds of Japanese*, figures 3.2 and 3.3

3. Consonants of Japanese

- Phonetic properties that are useful for classifying consonants in all languages:
 - voicing (voiced or voiceless?)
 - place of articulation (constriction location)
 - nasality (oral or nasal?)
 - manner of articulation (constriction type)
- Interactive <u>vocal-tract diagram</u>
