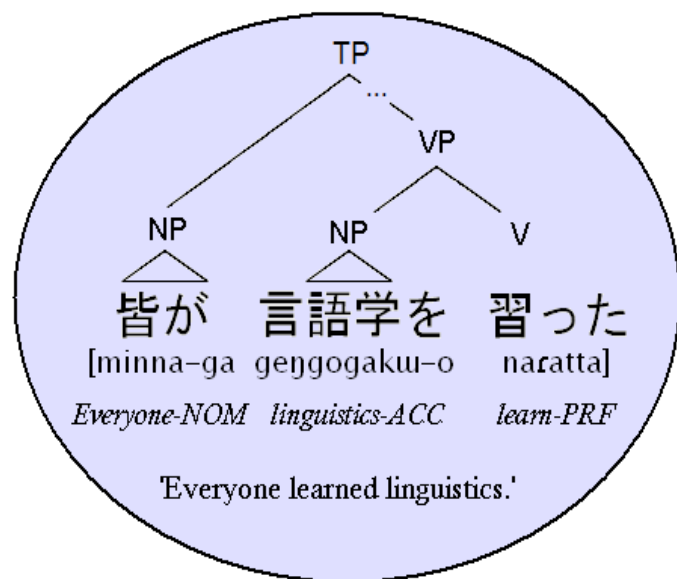
Structure of Japanese
