(a)	titi	o-too-san	'father'
(b)	haha	o-kaa-san	'mother'
(c)	ani	o-nii-san	'older brother'
(d)	ane	o-nee-san	'older sister'
(e)	otooto	otooto-san	'younger brother'
(f)	imooto	imooto-san	'younger sister'
(g)	ozi	ozi-san	'uncle'
(h)	oba	oba-san	'aunt'
(i)	sohu	o-zii-san	'grandfather'
(j)	sobo	o-baa-san	'grandmother'

- In what circumstances are the terms in Set #1 used?
- What about Set #2?

Implications:

- The morphemes *o-*, *-san* are known as *honorific* morphemes
