Components of grammar and differences among languages

Consider a language other than English that you speak or have studied. Choose **two** of the following four components of grammar (see also Table 1.3 on p 6 of *CL*) and show, for each component you choose, **at least one difference** between that language and English. Illustrate each difference that you discuss with *actual language data*—words, phrases, or sentences—that demonstrate how the two languages differ.

- **Phonetics/phonology:** Are there sounds or sound combinations in one language that do not occur in the other? (Be careful to think about the actual *pronunciation* of the languages, rather than spelling rules.)
- Morphology: Are there differences in the two languages' ways of building words?
- **Syntax:** Are there differences in the two languages' ways of building phrases or sentences?
- **Semantics:** Are there meaning differences in the two languages? For example, are there words in one language with no direct (one-word) translation into the other?
